As I write this month's article, it's hard to think of any other topic right now than what's currently going on in our world with the spread of COVID-19 and the associated quarantining of population. It's one of the strangest things many of us have witnessed in regard to the precautionary measures being taken. While very hard for many of you on an economic, social, and emotional level, we know that one day in the (hopefully near) future, life will resume back to fairly normal. Meanwhile, we don't want to neglect the most important aspect of our lives—the spiritual impact this is having.

As you're well aware by now, the social distancing and self-isolation involved with this pandemic means that we aren't able to meet together as the church to worship together, encourage each other, serve one another, commune together, and receive nourishment from the Word of God. That's so unfortunate, because I don't know about you, but that's the

highlight of my week—to gather with my church family and worship.

Just because we can't "go to church" right now doesn't mean we can't still "be the church" as always. We have a greater opportunity than ever to love on people in need, to check up on our neighbors, to call, text, or email one another to brighten someone's day. We can utilize social media to keep up with each other. I encourage you to practice "distant socializing," not just social distancing. Don't stop connecting, even though we can't have contact in person right now.

Here are a few other things you can do in the meantime, until things return to normal and we're able to meet again as the church. As the church scattered, we can be the church each week by participating in church online, along with a few other practices. If you don't have the internet to tune into our weekly service, try to find a sermon to listen to on TV or the radio. Here are few tips to keep you in the habit of attending worship. 1) Get out of bed and get dressed. This helps put you in the mindset to worship. 2) Go through your normal Sunday routine. 3) Gather your family together around the largest screen you're able to view the service on. And try to stay engaged; no multitasking through worship. 4) Clap, sing along, and sing loud. It may seem awkward at first, but it will seem more like you're "there." 5) Lean into the message. Open your Bible, take notes, and have a time of prayer at the end. Make your home your sanctuary.

Another practice we can continue to do to *be* the church is to give. We have an online giving portal set up at sandbornfcc.org/give, which is the easiest way for you to give your tithes and offerings. Another way is to mail your check to SFCC, PO Box 73, Sandborn, IN 47578. It is such a blessing to be able to share in God's work and to give Him back a portion of what He has given us (per His command). Knowing that bills continue, ministry doesn't cease, and our missions must continue to be supported, we are grateful for the opportunity to share in the blessing of giving to the Lord through our local church, even though a plate isn't being passed. You are the most generous people I've ever met, and you understand how God loves a cheerful giver.

Also, we can continue to pray for one another while we are isolated at home. Few things brighten another believer's day more than hearing from another person who reveals they've been praying for you. (1 Thes. 5:11) I would just remind you to take a few moments and lift up your brothers and sisters whenever they come to mind. Also, lift up our state and national leaders, our healthcare professionals (some are part of our church), and others in the most vulnerable positions right now.

Why does it matter that we continue to focus on *being* the church in this time? Because though it's a confusing time in our world, we can still continue to trust in the Lord's guidance, His peace, and His providence. We can continue to love, serve, and connect people to Christ during this time of uncertainty, as we look forward to reuniting one day.


ANNOUNCEMENTS


